Find Your People

PARENTS

- Reach out to PeerK12 & IAC to find out what other parents are in your school/district and we can connect you to them, as well as our WhatsApp groups, or create a new one
- Find out who the Jew Club Advisor is, ask them who the other trusted staff/allies are on campus. Who do the Jewish students turn to on campus?
- Recruit other parents to join you, Jewish or not. Find out who your fellow parent allies are and connect

STUDENTS

- Attend Jew/Israel Club meetings at school
- Connect with the other Jewish students, remember there is power in numbers and you don't have to face Jew-hatred alone
- Find out who your allies are, make sure your friends are the type of people who will come to your defense if needed
- Find out who the trusted staff members are, who can you turn to for help?

Incident Reporting

Are You a Victim of Antisemitism?

Incident Reporting

IS CRITICISM OF ISRAEL ANTISEMITIC? **THE 3 Ds TEST**

DEMONIZATION: When Israel and its leaders are made to seem completely evil; when Israel's actions are blown out of all sensible proportion; when Israel and Israelis are equated with Nazi Germany and Nazis; when Israel is seen as the sole cause for the situation in the Middle East. This is considered antisemitism, not legitimate criticism of Israel.

DOUBLE STANDARDS: When criticism of Israel is applied selectively and in a grossly unfair manner; when Israel is singled out when clearly immoral behavior of other nation-states is ignored; for example, when Israel is criticized by the United Nations for human rights abuses while the behavior of known and major abusers, such as China, Iran, Cuba, and Syria, is ignored—this is considered antisemitism.

DELEGITIMIZATION: When Israel's fundamental right to exist is denied alone among all peoples of the world, this too is considered antisemitism.

Incident Reporting

Are You a Victim of Antisemitism?

- Have your cell phones ready to film or photograph any incidents
 - Provides concrete evidence
 - Provides a timestamp & location
- Immediately following an antisemitic incident take a selfie video documenting everything that occurred
 - Provides a diary accounting
 - Include all details: names and description, time & location, your recollection of the course of events
 - Send it to info@peer12.org with your contact information
- Make a report to your trusted staff member

What Can You Do?

Step #1

Keep your school's WhatsApp active.

Identify the leaders.

If there are no other Jewish parents, PeerK12 is here for you.

Step #2

Utilize the power in numbers to ask for a meeting with school's administration BEFORE anything controversial happens.

Step #3

Offer the group up as a resource to PREVENT anything bad from happening.

Keep it POSITIVE and PROACTIVE.

Step #4

Now they know we are paying attention.

Follow-up is key. Always thank staff for taking ACTION.

Pay Attention

Jewish parents and students need to be on the lookout for specific terminology that may seem benign and, in certain contexts, may be entirely unobjectionable, but they often signal a strong ideological agenda on the part of the schools.

When schools adopt such radical pedagogies, antisemitism is never far behind.

The radical ideology provides a permission structure for activist educators to impose their distorted perspectives on students.

What Can You Do?

- 1 Ask around about the teacher from your parent group to know what to expect from this teacher/class.
- 2 Set-up a meeting with the teacher. Do not go alone. Do not assume the worst. Take notes. Remember you are building a relationship.
- 3 Let them know your concerns and ask – innocently – if and how they plan on teaching these subjects. Listen for the keywords.
- 4 Ask for curriculum in relevant subjects. You have a legal right to see the curriculum. If they say no, you can go to the VP or Principal – what are they hiding?
